Community Center Park Usage Survey Committee - 21 August 2016

A year ago a group of your neighbors formed a partnership to buy the privately owned 7.5-acre parcel, formerly known as the Wills Hunting Camp, in the 1700 block of Wintercamp Trail. This action was taken to save and preserve the land for the future recreational use and enjoyment by all residents of The Woods community. The parcel was purchased and is directed by the group Community Center Partners LLC. CCPLLC is not affiliated with and is not funded by PVP, The Woods Club, The Woods Homeowners Association, or any other organization.

Every resident of our community is invited to participate in planning and creating this recreational park property. Your support is needed to identify recreational priorities for outdoor land use, and the feasibility of a large community center structure in the future. A volunteer committee is needed to organize and distribute and evaluate a survey asking the community what outdoor activities and amenities they would enjoy and support for themselves, their families, friends and guests. Until the community identifies the specific park assets and outdoor activities the community would most enjoy and support, the survey will not include questions concerning funding or maintenance.

The designing, financing and construction of the Community Park's outdoor structures and amenities will begin when the community's needs and wants are identified. For example, neighbor focus groups have already voiced their wants for outdoor recreational amenities such as family gathering-sized pavilions with water, electric service, and restrooms, playground equipment, picnic tables, gardening and nature areas, walking paths and hiking trails, outdoor bocce ball and volleyball courts, a dog park, and toss game areas.
